






Luke 15

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fifteenth chapter.



¹Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. ²And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them."

³So he told them this parable: ⁴"What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? ⁵And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. ⁶And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' ⁷Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

Today is the Third Sunday after Trinity, or the Sunday of God's Unconditional Mercy. We have a parable that shows us how crazy our Lord's love is for us. The Parable of the Prodigal or the Lost Sons. The context of this parable and the two before it is when Jesus was surrounded by tax collectors and open sinners, and the Pharisees questioned Him for hanging around with such unrepentant transgressors. Jesus then spoke about how

any one of them would search diligently for a lost sheep, or for a lost coin, and would receive a son back home even if he had done terrible things. Jesus is saying, "If you will do this for things like a sheep or a coin, and even would welcome back a son who wished you were dead, how much more will God do for those who have gone astray?" Yes, Jesus does not wait for us to get our act together, but searches for us, both on the cross when He assumed as His own all our sins, and still today by sending out the Holy Spirit to bring us to church to receive the benefits of the cross for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. May the Holy Spirit be granted to us anew this day, that we may see the great love our God has for us, and in turn love our neighbor in the same fashion. May we see that we fail at this love, and rather than despair because of it, let the Law have no place in our conscience, for there only Jesus calls the shots, and He declares us forgiven, just as righteous as He is, that we may dwell with His Father forever in heaven. Amen.
